Now that You Have Your F-1 Visa

A visa allows you to travel from your country to a port of entry in the U.S. In many cases, that port of entry will be the airport where you land. When you deplane, follow the directions for the non-citizen entry.

At the airport, a U.S. official will interview you and verify all of your paperwork (i.e. Passport, F-1 visa and I-20 form). Once admitted you will receive an immigration stamp and proceed to baggage claim and U.S. Customs.

Helpful Facts About the United States

U.S. Currency

The U.S. monetary system follows a base-ten decimal system with the dollar (\$) being the basic unit. Common bill denominations are \$1, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, and \$100. A dollar can be subdivided into 100 cents (\$\phi\$) using coins. The coins are; 1ϕ , 5ϕ , 10ϕ , 25ϕ , 50ϕ , (or penny, nickel, dime, quarter, and half-dollar, respectively).


When traveling, it is best not to carry large sums of money as cash. Traveler's Checks are commonly used and available from foreign exchange banks or brokers and American Express offices. At the time you purchase traveler's check, you sign your name on each check (which can come in various denominations). You will then sign the Traveler's Check a second time at the time you want to cash them (i.e. exchange them for cash or make purchases).


Traveler's Checks are a safe and convenient way to carry money since most businesses and services accept them as payment. They also have a reimbursement guarantee if they are lost or stolen, with the proper documentation, of course.

U.S. Telephones

U.S. phone numbers have seven digits. However, an additional three digits "AREA CODE", needs to precede all numbers called outside of the local area access. For example, our office phone number is 558-4955 within the area code of (909). However, to call our office from another area code like LAX located in the city of Los Angeles, whose area code is (310), therefore you would need to dial 1-(909)558-4955. The 1 in the front of any number signals the phone company equipment that you are making a phone call to out side of the designated local area.


